
START

Dental hygienists must hold an associates degree. Many community colleges and dental schools offer 2-year dental hygiene programs.

get LICENSED

Eligibility requirements vary by state, but hygienists must hold postsecondary credentials from accredited programs. Other requirements include CPR certification, transcripts and letters of recommendation.
