

What is a Pediatric Dentist?

Pediatric dentists are primary and specialty oral care providers for infants and children through adolescence, including those with special health needs. They focus on prevention and treatment, and educating parents on how to best treat their children.

START




Obtain a **BACHELOR'S DEGREE**

Dentist's must have a bachelor's degree to attend dental school. Biology, child development, chemistry, psychology and business are all applicable focuses.

Graduate from DENTAL SCHOOL

After completing a bachelor's degree, the next step is dental school, where a DDS or DDM is received. Dental school provides basic dental education, but a pediatric dentist requires specialty education.



Get LICENSED

In order to be a registered dentist, the American Dental Association's National Board Dental Examinations must be passed.

Complete **RESIDENCY**

The American Academy of Pediatric Dentists has approved programs throughout the U.S. that accept qualified candiates. The residency programs focus on pediatric-specific education and clinical experiences.
